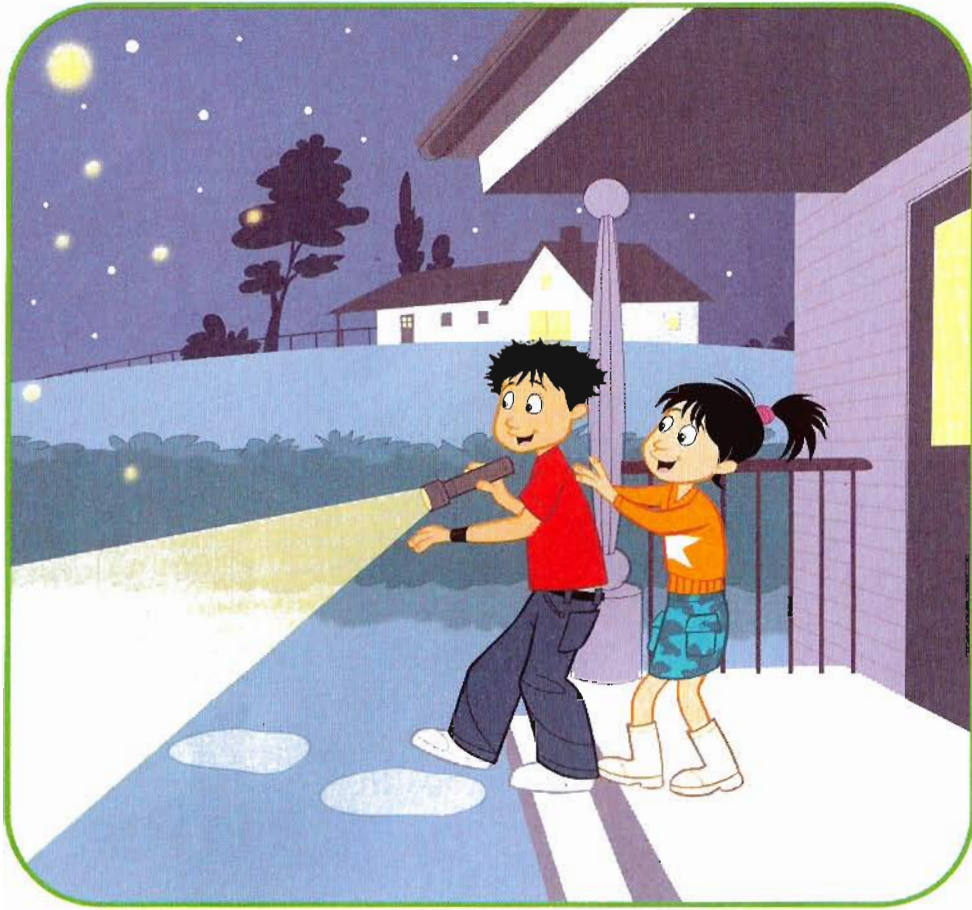


Greg and Ann are brother and sister.

 “Ask your mother,” says father.



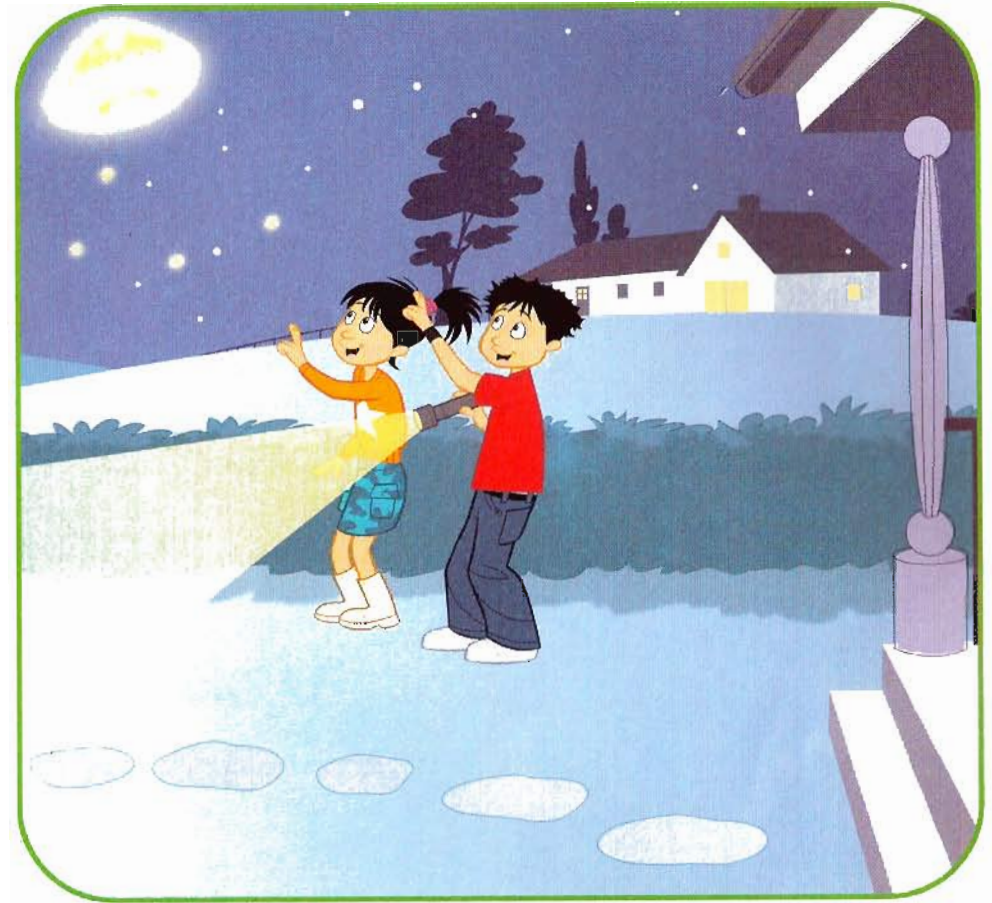
“Let’s go out to look for fireflies,” says Greg.

“Look at that big one!” says Ann.



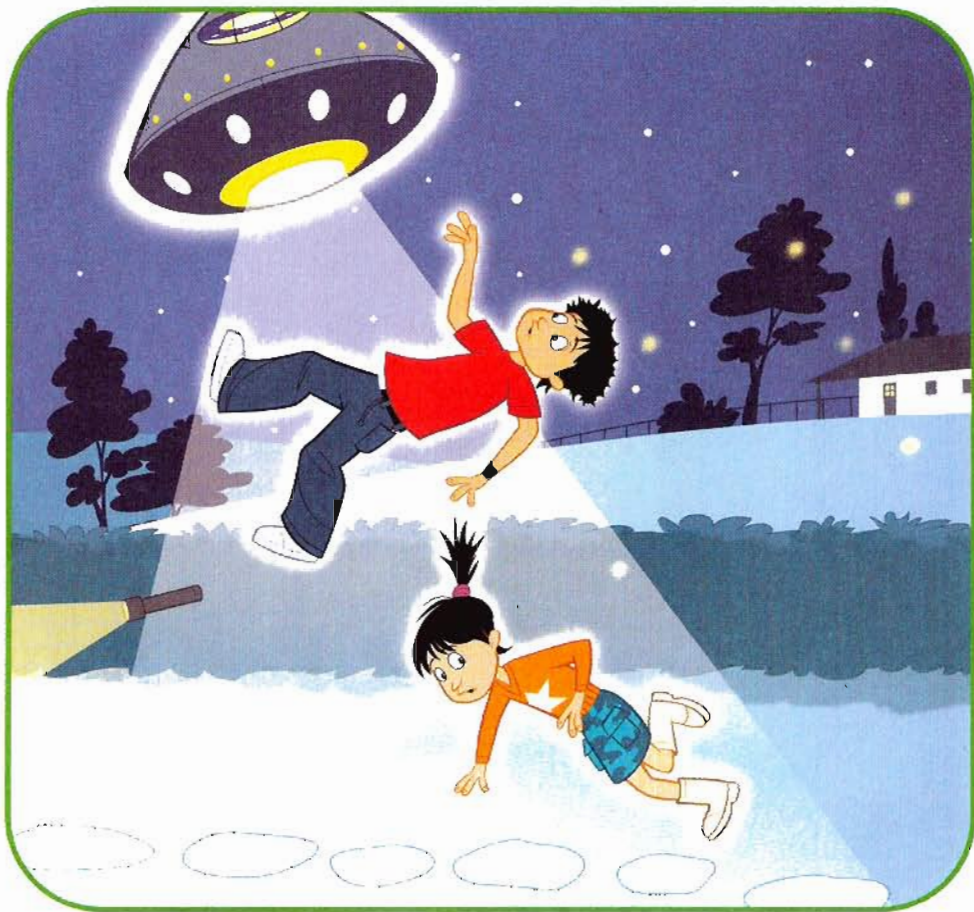
“It looks like a triangle,” says Ann.

“It’s a spaceship!”

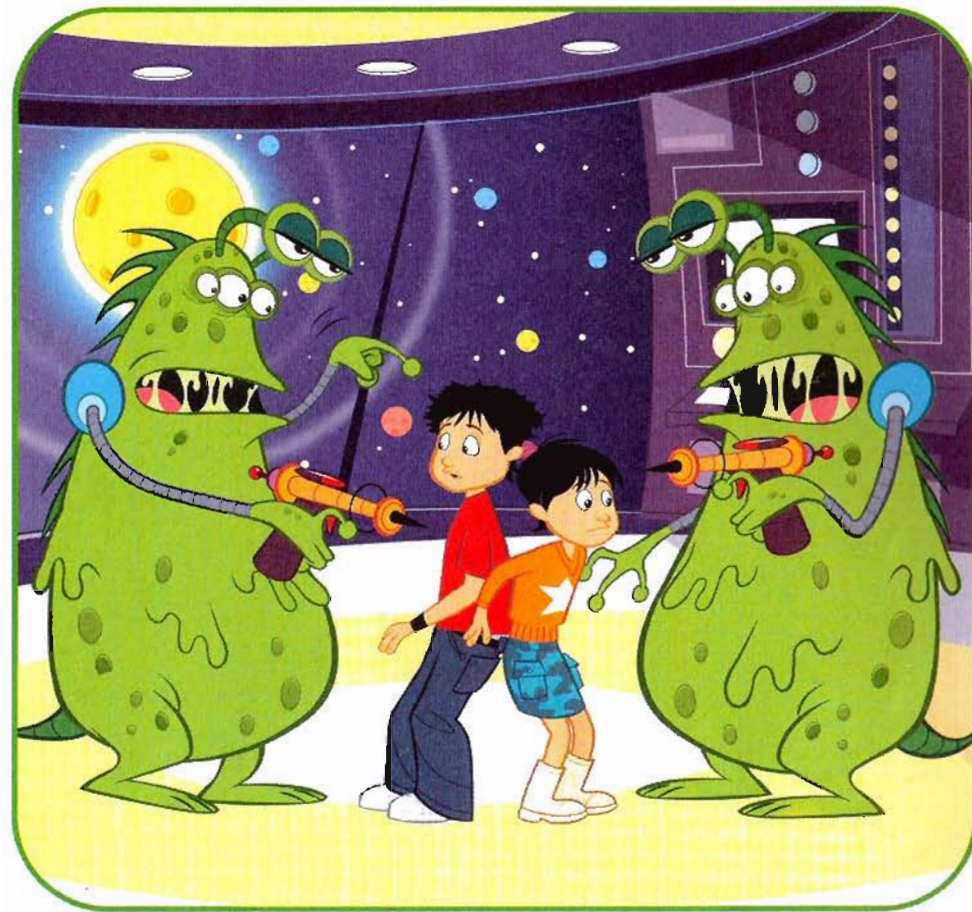


“Oh no!” says Greg. “What’s happening?”

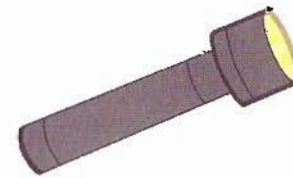
