## JUST/ ALREADY/ YET/ STILL

JUST i ALREADY s'utilitzen amb més freqüència en la forma verbal de **Present Perfect**:

I have **just** done the washing-up. (Acabo de fer els deures)

They have **already** arrived at the station. (Ja han arribat a l'estació)

Ordre: entre mig de l'auxiliar i el verb.

**YET** vol dir encara (frases negatives) o ja (frases interrogatives).

He hasn't come yet.( Encara no ha arribat)

Has he arrived yet? ( ja ha arrivat?)

Ordre: al final de la frase

**STILL** vol dir encara en frases afirmatives i interrogatives.

Normalment es fa servir en temps 'continuous'

He is still doing the homework? (Encara està fent els deures)

Is he still doing the homework?

Ordre: després del subjecte
