Argumentative compositions

Some composition questions ask you to present the advantages and disadvantages of something or the arguments for and against and issue. You can do this in one of the following ways:

- 1. Present both sides of the issue equally.
- 2. Take one side and then support your opinion.
- 3. Present the arguments and then offer your own conclusions or suggestions..

You should present the arguments logically and try to include examples or facts which support them. When we **compare or contrast two things**, certain connectors are frequently used, for example: **both**, **just as**, **by comparison**, **contrary to**...
