In the computer class: Tips for success- well, sort of ;-)...

Be on good terms with the Computer Coordinator at your highschool. S/he can make your life at the computer room much easier!

All students should know IN ADVANCE the task they are supposed to carry out. Avoid giving any instructions in front of the computers... their attention is wandering... to the screen!!!

Always have a non- electronic back-up activity available: technical problems occur too often, unfortunately.

Check the links shortly before class: Internet is a non-stop change.

Students should work in pairs, in threes on the odd occasion only.

Try to have several different addresses to carry out a task: in case one didn't work, or one was slower...

Make sure the computers have the software needed for a specific task or to download a specific web . Eg: webcams, macromedia flash players, real audio...

Use the Intranet of the Highschool, if possible. Mi PC >T:\ is an excellent place for your students to record their work, without having to use their CDs or diskettes all the time. You can create a folder for each class and each student or pair with all their projects. It has also the advantadge that their work is in all the computers and the students neeedn't always be working on the same computer. Once a term, students can record their work in a CD or diskette and the intranet is clean again.

Make your tasks multi-level: Highly skilled students at Computers are generally good at English too.... Have more demanding or extra-tasks for early finishers and keep it simple for slow-pacers. Otherwise some activities seem to drag eternally...

Be calm and patient: Students need your constant help both technical and linguistic at first. However, they become more autonomous with time and you end up learning from them! Allow creativity and more complex technical skills if students ask for it and know how to do it.
