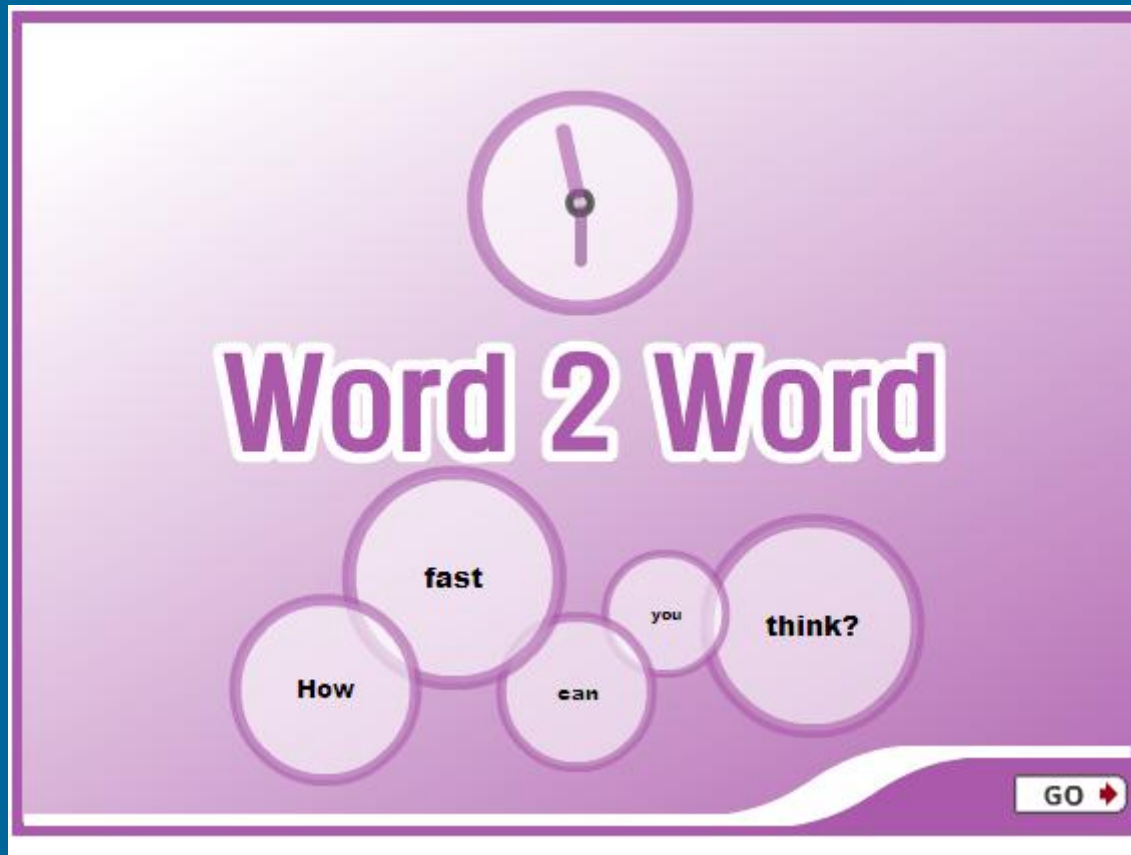

Endangered or Extinct?

- The number of people in the world is GROWING.
- But this is not true for all animals.
- In some cases, there are only a few of one type of animal left in the wild.
- These animals are endangered.
- If they die out completely, they become extinct.



Why does this happen?

There are lots of **REASONS** why animals become endangered or extinct.

- loss of habitat (trees of the forests cut down, rivers drying up...)



- chemicals or pollution.



- hunting (for sport, their fur, tusks or meat).



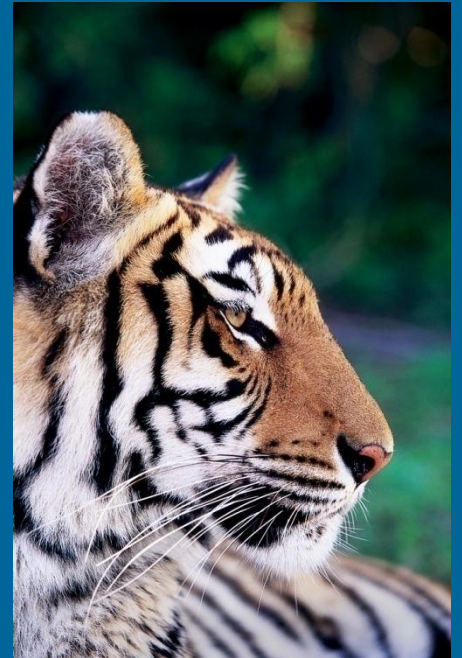
