1980s	During the 1980s, a whole host of characters urge kids to participate in Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF including Kermit the Frog, Casper the Friendly Ghost, Hello Kitty, Paddington Bear, Scooby Doo, Spiderman and Alf!
1990s	Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF celebrations expand to the whole month of October.
2000	Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF celebrates its 50th Anniversary!
2001	Kids raise money through Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF to help their peers living in Afghanistan - the first time in history that fund are dedicated to a specific UNICEF program.
2004	Motivated by the devastating South Asia Tsunami, U.S. kids raise \$10 million on top of the \$5 million they already raised through Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF.
2005	For the first time in history, UNICEF is asked to help kids in the U.S. and 50% of all Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF donations are dedicated to Hurricane Katrina relief.
2008	Kids, schools, adults, groups and corporations have raised over \$140 million to-date!
