## Teaching notes <br> Lesson 2: SOLID SHAPES

| $9^{\text {th }}$ session: 3-D shapes around us |  |
| :---: | :---: |
| AIMS | - To name solid and flat shapes and select a particular 2-D or 3-D shape. <br> - To identify shapes in the surrounding environment. <br> - To classify objects according to their shapes. <br> - To work in groups. |
| RESOURCES | - A computer and a data projector for the power point presentation. <br> - A selection of solid shapes. <br> - Supplementary material: <br> (solid_flat_shapes.ppt) <br> (solid_shapes_around_us.ppt) |
| GROUPING | - Half group. |
| DESCRIPTION OF THE <br> ACTIVITIES | $1{ }^{\text {st }}$ activity: <br> Choose between two! (solid_flat_shapes.ppt) Watch the power point presentation to revisit all the names of solid shapes and their properties. Show slides 1 to 10 to review the vocabulary by choosing between two names for each shape. <br> Show slides 11 to 15 to revisit the features of each shape. After the name of each shape appears, the teacher asks the following questions: <br> - What are the shapes of the faces? <br> Notice that the normal definitions of faces are not appropriate for the cone and the sphere. |


|  | $2^{\text {nd }}$ activity: <br> I spy with my little eye (solid_shapes_around_us.ppt) Teacher holds up a shape and asks pupils to look for things the same shape in the classroom. "I spy with my little eye a shape like this". After looking for a few shapes, watch the power point presentation and recognize the shapes that are shown. $3^{\text {rd }}$ activity: <br> Let's make a display with solid shapes! Look for things in the classroom, magazines, newspapers, catalogues, pictures etc.. that are solid shapes. Classify them according to their shape in a big display. Ask pupils to look for more objects at home and add them to the display according to the classification. |

| LANGUAGE | Key vocabulary: <br> - Cube, cuboid, cylinder, sphere, cone and pyramid. <br> - Square, triangle, circle and rectangle. <br> - Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, pictures. <br> - Scissors, glue and display paper. <br> key phrases needed: <br> - What are the shapes of the faces?. <br> - I spy with my little eye a shape like this (the answers to this sentence by pupils will be in L1 and teacher will say the name in English). <br> - What shape is this? It's a .... <br> - What shape do you recognize? |
