AIMS	<ul> <li>To count reliably up to ten fingers.</li> <li>To find one more than a given number from 1 to 9.</li> <li>To recall the lyrics of the Counting Rhyme.</li> <li>To work on social skills.</li> </ul>

GROUPING	Half of the class.
DESCRIPTION OF THE ACTIVITIES	<ul> <li>1<sup>st</sup>activity:</li> <li>Game: 'Show me'(numbers_flashcards.pdf)</li> <li>Teacher shows a flashcard of a number from 1 to 10 and pupils show the right number of fingers First, children work out the number with their hands behind their backs, and then, they show the corresponding numbers with their fingers when the teacher says "one, two, three show me". Children put the fingers away and start with another number.</li> <li>2<sup>nd</sup> activity: The Elephants Counting Rhyme (flashcards_elephants.pdf).</li> <li>Review the lyrics and the meaning of The Elephants Counting Rhyme using flashcards This time you can continue the Counting Rhyme to ten. Every time another elephant is about to arrive, ask the pupils: What's one more than?</li> <li>After the elephant arrive, ask the pupils:</li> </ul>

	How many elephants altogether are now playing on the spider web?
LANGUAGE	Key vocabulary: - Numerals 1-10, elephants. Key phrases needed: - One, two, three show me! - Fingers away! - What's one more than? - How many altogether?
